

1 QUALIFICATION STATEMENT OF

3 Witness for the Bonneville Power Administration

5 *Q. Please state your name, employer, and business address.*

6 A. My name is Daniel H. Fisher. I am employed by the Bonneville Power Administration
7 (BPA), 905 NE 11th Avenue, Portland, Oregon.

8 *Q. In what capacity are you employed?*

9 A. I am the manager of BPA's Power Rates Group.

10 *Q. Please state your educational background.*

11 A. I received a Bachelor of Science degree in Economics/Management Science from the
12 University of California at San Diego in 2002.

13 *Q. Please summarize your professional experience.*

14 A. In March of 2004, I began work at Economic Insight, Inc., as a staff economist for
15 Samuel Van Vactor. I worked as an analyst for the energy consulting side of the business
16 and as a reporter for the Energy Market Report.

17 In September of 2005, I was hired by BPA's Power Rates Group as an Industry
18 Economist. I assisted with BPA's WP-07 wholesale power rate proposal, with primary
19 focus on risk policy and the flexible PF program.

20 I was a co-analyst on rate design issues in BPA's WP-10 rate proceeding, with
21 primary focus on Priority Firm Preference and Industrial Firm Power rate design. In
22 addition, I was a co-analyst for the embedded cost-pricing methodology portion of the
23 Generation Inputs Study.

1 I was the lead analyst on Tier 1 rate design for the post-FY 2011 contract period,
2 which is reflected in the Tiered Rate Methodology. I was also the lead analyst in pricing
3 the Resource Support Services that BPA offers in the post-FY 2011 contract period.

4 I was a policy lead and lead analyst for Generation Inputs in the BP-14 and BP-16
5 rate proceedings with primary focus on cost allocation. I was also the technical lead on
6 power rate and product design. In the BP-18 and BP-20 rate proceeding, I was the Power
7 Rates Manager.

8 *Q. Please state your experience as a witness in previous proceedings.*

9 *A.* In the BP-20 rate proceeding, I was a witness on Power Rate Policy, Power Issues, Risk,
10 and Power and Transmission Joint Policy. In the BP-18 rate proceeding, I was a witness
11 on Power Rate Policy, Financial Reserves Policy, the Generation Inputs Settlement
12 Agreement, the Power Rate Study, and the Spill Surcharge. In the BP-16 rate
13 proceeding, I was a witness on Generation Inputs, Tier 1 and Tier 2 rate design, Resource
14 Support Services, the NR Energy Shaping Service, the NR Resource Flattening Service,
15 and Unanticipated Load Service. In the BP-14 rate proceeding, I was a witness on
16 Generation Inputs, Tier 1 and Tier 2 rate design, Resource Support Services, the Slice
17 True-Up, the Unauthorized Increase Charge, and Unanticipated Load Service. I was also
18 a witness on rate design in (1) BPA's Tiered Rate Methodology proceeding; (2) the
19 BP-12 rate proceeding; (3) the WP-10 rate proceeding, in which I also testified regarding
20 Generation Inputs; and (4) the WP-07 supplemental rate proceeding.
